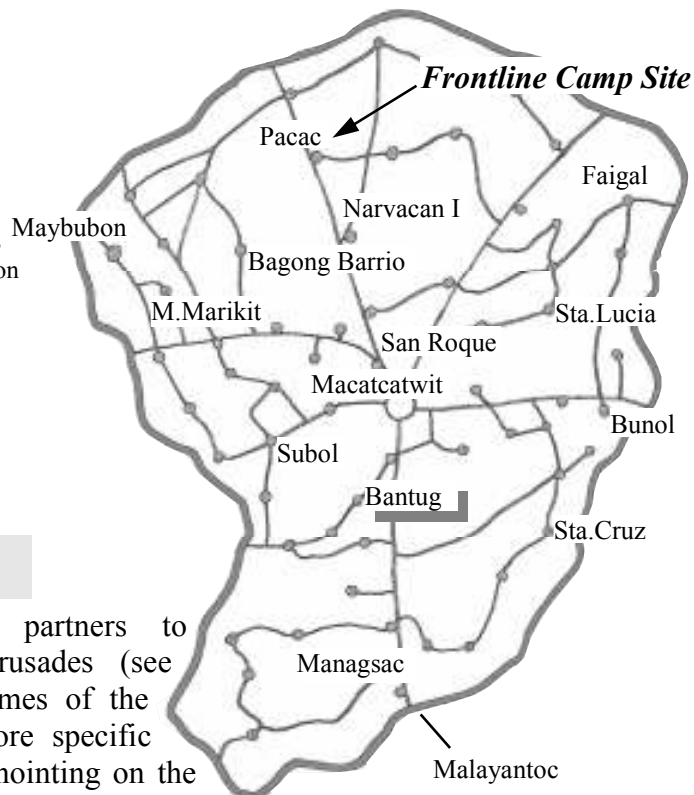
The Frontline Assault on Guimba!
